# THE HISTORIANS

There is a long relationship between the countries featured in my report on Round 8, Portugal CBL and Argentina. It dates back to the sixteenth century when Portuguese explorers first navigated the River Plate.

Despite holding two aces East took South at his word. North led the ♦4 and South won with the ace and returned the five, North ruffing with the three and switching to the ♣6. South won with the ace and returned the ♦7 for North to ruff. If North returns the ♣9 he will score another ruff but unsure of the position he cashed the ♣K, four down, -800.

The clue is that if South did not hold the ♣Q he would have returned ♦Q rather than the seven.

South led the ♣2 and North won with the ace and returned the nine, declarer cashing the ♣KQ to dispose of a spade. A spade to the king was followed by a second spade and South won and switched to a diamond for the jack and king. Declarer ruffed a spade with the ♦A, and claimed 11 tricks, +150.

West led the ♦4 for the eight, queen and ace and declarer continued with four rounds of hearts, West discarding a spade, a diamond and a club. Having taken the jack East returned a diamond and West cleared the suit. When declarer continued with a club West took the ace and cashed two diamonds, one down, -100.

After winning the diamond lead declarer cashed the ♥KQ and saw West pitch the ♣3. He played a club and West took the ace (ducking does not help) and continued with the king then nine of diamonds. Declarer won, pitching a heart from dummy, played a club to the king, a spade to the ace, a heart to the ace and a spade to the jack.

It was a little surprising once West had left dummy's ♣K intact that declarer had not ducked a heart to East, but he had nine tricks, +600 and 12 IMPs.

East led the  $\diamond 8$  for the nine, ten and ace and declarer drew trumps and exited with a club. East won with the ten and exited with the  $\diamond 7$ . Dummy's jack lost to the queen, but declarer could ruff the club return and cash dummy's diamonds pitching a spade. He returned to hand with the  $\heartsuit K$  and played the  $\spadesuit 4$ . When East followed with the three declarer guessed to play dummy's ten and that was one down, -100.

The play was identical in this room, with one significant detail – when East followed with the  $\spadesuit 3$  declarer, tipped off by East's double, went up with dummy's king for +620 and 12 IMPs.

Having taken the  $\clubsuit 10$ , East has to find a switch to a low spade (ace and another does not work, as declarer can take dummy's king, ruff a club and exit with the  $\spadesuit J$  to endplay West). If declarer guesses to play a diamond at trick four he can't then be defeated as long as he gets the spades right.

A fascinating deal – see if you can work out how to make 4 $\heartsuit$  after a trump lead - it led to a 44-27 win for Portugal.

## A TALE OF TWO SLAMS

In the Round 4 POLAND 4 BOCHEŃSKI faced USA 2 SIMSON.

At Twitch featured table Marek Szymanowski - Alfred Bocheński played against Barry Rigal - Glenn Milgrim.

In board 2 Marek Szymanowski bid a slam in three bids, like on the next page:

His partner provided him with perfect values, so he could claim 12 tricks. This board should have warned North/South pair that Marek is not a tight-passive

player. Four boards later came the board which troubled many players at many tables and Marek jumped to slam again.

## GOLDEN HARVEST FROM THE ALMANAC OF POLISH BRIDGE

The 1994 World Championships were the real golden harvest for Polish players. In Albuquerque, where this event was held, they won 4 medals:

**MIXED PAIRS:**

1. Danuta Hochecker - Apolinary Kowalski
3. Ewa Harasimowicz - Marcin Leśniewski

**OPEN PAIRS:**

1. Marcin Leśniewski - Marek Szymanowski

**ROSENBLUM CUP**

2. Marek Borewicz - Erwin Otvosi, Piotr Gawryś - Krzysztof Lasocki and one more pair.

Let's see how Leśniewski (TSC POLAND 2) and Szymanowski (TSC POLAND 4) fought for the titles of world champions.

Marcin Leśniewski (3 times world champion – pairs in 1994 and transnational teams in 1997 and 2005, 3 times European champion – teams in 1993, pairs in 1989 and mixed pairs in 1992) still considers his defence in this board to be one of the best in his entire long career.

After the standard bidding, Tim Seres was playing 3NT. The first lead of the ten of hearts was ducked, the heart continuation was taken with the king, and in the third trick the declarer entered the

dummy with king of diamonds. His next move was a spade to nine in the hand. Leśniewski took the trick with the queen and returned a spade (!). Seres passed to the jack, because his plan for the rest of the game was as follows: ace of diamonds (they are divided 3-2) and to give up the third diamond, then go to the ace-king of spades with the fourth diamond and declare nine tricks. After playing the ace of diamonds, however, it turned out that the honors of spades are no longer available, so 3NT ended in a slip-up three down for 300.

Note that if Leśniewski had continued with hearts after taking the trick for queen of spades, Seres could check the distribution of diamonds and take the seven tricks owed him at this moment. The difference between the 200 and 300 for EW was nearly half the top.

Here is example of the excellent bidding of Marcin and Marek in the decisive phase of the battle for gold medals.
