

In Round 9 I decided to keep an eye on the top three tables. The match between BELGIUM and TURKEY was a well-contested, low scoring affair, so I'll concentrate on the other two, ITALY -USA 1 WOLFSON and ENGLAND MOSSOP - USA 3 LEVINE.

West led the  $\triangle$  A and switched to the  $\lozenge$  8, East winning with the king and switching to the  $\clubsuit$ 6. Declarer winning with the queen and playing the  $\spadesuit$ Q. West ducked and East ruffed and exited with the  $\lozenge$ 10. Declarer won with the queen, drew trumps discarding the  $\spadesuit$ 9 from dummy, played a diamond to the ace and pitched a heart on the  $\spadesuit$ J. West won, cashed the  $\lozenge$ J and played a heart to East's ace for three down, -150.

North led the ♠J and when it held he switched

to the  $\clubsuit$ K, South overtaking, cashing the queen and playing the  $\spadesuit$ Q. Declarer won with the ace, and ran the jack of diamonds, South winning and continuing with the  $\clubsuit$ J, ruffed and overruffed by North who exited with the  $\spadesuit$ 9. Declarer won and played a diamond, North taking the ace, declarer unblocked the king, cashing the  $\spadesuit$ 10 and playing a heart. With an awkward decision declarer refused the finesse so that was two down, -500 and a 12 IMP swing.







Here Italians had better toy, one of the Italian origin. Declarer won the club lead with dummy's ace, ran the  $\heartsuit Q$  to North's king, ruffed the club return, cashed the  $\heartsuit A$ , crossed to dummy with a spade and drew the outstanding trump, +480 and 11 IMPs.

Italy just got over the line, 48-46. 16 pairs got to 6%.

When North pitched a diamond he was thrown in and had to lead into declarer's  $\heartsuit AQ$  at the end, +420 and 11 IMPs.


# ARRIVAL OF PEPSI FROM THE ALMANAC OF POLISH BRIDGE

## Włodek Starkowski

In 1998 the World Championships were played in Lille, France. The gold medal in the open pairs tournament was won again by Polish pair. This time Jacek Pszczoła and Michał Kwiecień (here, in TSC POLAND 1 MARKOWICZ) won the World Champions title. During the finals a nickname "Pepsi" appeared in the bridge world. Rama comentators, who had problems to pronounce "Pszczoła", after a few approximations started to call Jacek "Pepsi" and it is in use till today.

The most important asset in the game of the new world champions was bold bidding, without any half-measures, paired with flawless declarer's play. They had of course also a bit of luck, but Fortune is usually on the winners' side.

Look at the two examples of the style of Kwiecień and Pszczoła, both from Lille championships:

Fortunately, North started "safely" from his diamond honors and now declarer was given his chance. Kwiecień took full advantage of it. He took the first trick with the ace, played the queen of hearts, which he overtook by the king at the dummy, and played a club to the king (!) in his hand, and then played the club again. Eleven tricks, 660 and 95% for Michał and Jacek.

Was it possible not to win this tournament by playing this way?

This gold was a start of two brillant careers. before 1998 they won silver in European teams and bronze in world transnational teams (both 1997), and later some more medals were added. "Pepsi" begun to play in USA (he was a Player of the Year of ACBL in 2019), winning gold of Bermuda Bowl for that country in 2017 in Lyon.

Michał Kwiecień also got some successes in the US, but his latest achievements are at the senior field – gold in seniors championships of World Bridge Series 2018 in Orlando and in seniors tournament of European Open Championships in 2019 in Istanbul.
