The same lead and the same result. If EW had reached 6♥ would North have found a club lead? Even if he does, will South find the spade switch after taking dummy's king with the ace? In some situations South might be able to redouble to show a high honour in clubs, which might help North with the opening lead.

I went to check the other tables only to discover that they were all playing different boards.

king declarer cashed the top spades and then played the \diamond Q. North ruffed and exited with a club, South taking the ace and playing the \diamond 10. Declarer could ruff in dummy, but had to lose another club, -100

South led the ♠ 9 and declarer won with the ace, crossed to the \diamond A and ran the ♠ J collecting South's ten. The ♣ 7 saw North put up the king and exited with the \diamond 6. Declarer won, cashed the ♠ K and exited with a club. South had to win with the ace and seeing the endplay coming he tried the ♥ J. Declarer put up dummy's ace, pitching a diamond and played a club, establishing a trick for the jack, +620 and 12 IMPs.

Having won with the ♣ K North needs to exit with the ♣ 5, not an easy play to find. If declarer plays the ♠ J from dummy at trick one then the defenders will be struggling.

Lithuania led 16-8 after 12 deals.

Start of the second half was silent, and the board 17 arrived, where the system made the difference:

South led the \diamond 3 and declarer won with the king, preserving diamond entries to dummy and played the ♣ Q. South took the ace, cashed the ♠ K and then tried the \diamond 10. When dummy's jack held declarer played a club to the jack followed by the ♥ Q, establishing a ninth trick, +400.

king, North taking the ace and exiting with a third club. Declarer ruffed, drew the outstanding trumps and cashed the \diamond KQJ before playing a heart, +620

The description ascribed to South's double is „unclear” – probably it asked North to choose between defending or sacrificing.

The first six tricks were identical, but then declarer immediately played the \diamond KQJ and North could ruff the third round for one down, -200 and a 13 IMP swing.

North led the \heartsuit 8 and declarer took South's king with the ace, cashed the \spadesuit AK, ruffed a heart, came to hand with a diamond, cashed the \heartsuit Q pitching a club, ruffed a heart and played winning diamonds. He then exited with the \spadesuit 10 and North had to lead a club, +980.

During World Bridge Games (formerly Bridge Olympiad) Polish team, with following players: Cathy Bałdysz - Ewa Banaszekiewicz, Katarzyna Dufurat - Justyna Żmuda, Danuta Kazmucha - Natalia Sakowska won a bronze medal.

The most dramatic course was the match at Round of 16 against USA with multiple world champions. Three boards before the end Poland was leading 187-179 when board 30/VI came:

The double of 3NT was obviously calling for the club lead. Cathy trusted Beth Palmer that she had 5 or more club tricks, from the top or after side entry and decided to convert 3NT into Moysian fit 4♠.

West led ♣K, ducked by declarer. At trick 2 Palmer continued with ♥J. Ewa took it with the ace and played ♠10, ducking in dummy. Lynn Deas took the trick with the jack and did not find the killing club continuation, playing a heart instead.

Banaszekiewicz took the trick with the queen and ♠9. Low from West and Ewa solved the problem in the right way – she played the king. When the queen fell, spades were continued and the contract was made. 10 tricks, 420 and 1 imp for Poland.

After that match there was a quarterfinal victory against Brazil and a defeat in semifinal against Russia. In the play-off for a bronze medal Poland won against France.

One more hand which is worth showing is from Robin Round match against Canada.

Linda Wynston led the ace of hearts, ruffed by Żmuda.

Now ace of clubs was cashed and declarer played a low spade from the hand towards 10875 in dummy. East took the trick with the queen and „safely” exited with a diamond.

That was enough for the declarer, as she has now cashed all the clubs to the following position:

Now Justyna played a diamond to the ace and East was squeezed in major suits.

It was the start of a series of medals for Justyna and Kasia. They established the position as one of the top women pairs winning four silver medals in European women pairs championships. There is still time for the gold in a pairs event!

Gold was won in European teams championships in Ostende 2018 but it will be quite another story.

For the registration it suffices to send:

- The name of the team. It must be the name of a town, no matter how small.
- The name of the captain (BBO's and real name), and his email.

In the last edition, Fall 2020, eighty-eight teams have played from twenty-nine countries in Europe and Africa.

There aren't limits to the number of players per team (but read the rules). The Captain will be responsible for his players and has to guarantee that all them have read the rules, especially the System Policy and the Anti-cheating policy paragraphs.

By car: 200 km from Stockholm. 280 km from Gothenburg. 500 km from Malmö.

How to get to the Bridge Festival venue: Conventum Arena (Fabriksgatan 28) is situated in the middle of the city, just 200 meters from the Örebro Södra train station, and straight across the street from Scandic Grand Hotel.
