You don't see many out and out psyches, but third in hand playing a system where opening bids at the one level are limited and the opponents are vulnerable is as good as it gets.

South led the ♥7 and North took the ace and switched to the ♦9 for the three, four and jack. A spade to the queen lost and South returned the ♣2, declarer winning with the ace, cashing the ♠A and ruffing

a spade. When he played dummy's ♦2 North ruffed with the ♣9 and cashed the ♠J, two down, -200 and 11 IMPs.

North won with the jack and switched to the ♣J and declarer took the ace, crossed to dummy's ♥K, cashed the ♠J and played a heart for ten tricks, +620.

South led the ♦10 and declarer won with dummy's ace and played a club, North winning with the jack and playing the ♦5. Declarer ruffed, played a heart to

the king and ran the ♠Q, South winning and playing the ♦K. Declarer ruffed and cashed the ♥A, the 4-1 break condemning him to one down, -100 and the loss of another 12 IMPs.

Can you make the contract if hearts are 4-1?

The answer is yes, but it will need some care. Suppose declarer hangs on to the ♥A, cashes the ♣A, ruffs a club and plays the ♥10. If North covers declarer wins, cashes the ♠9, crosses to the ♠10 and plays a diamond, promoting the ♥9. However, if North follows smoothly with the ♥8 declarer has to guess to play low.

The only slender clue might be how North played on the ♠Q - here he followed with the two.

Two smaller swings saw USA 2 Simpson ahead 35-0.

South led the ♦8 and when declarer put in the queen North won with the king and played four rounds of spades, South ruffing with the ♥9. There still a trump loser, three down, -300.

On another day declarer would have put up dummy's ace and ducked a heart to South, overruffed North on the second round of diamonds, cashed the other top heart and then cashed four clubs via the finesse, the fourth club and the ♦Q taking care of two of the losing spades.

East continued with the ♦10 and declarer ruffed with the ♥8, West throwing the ♠3. A heart to the king was followed by a spade to the ace. West scored the ♥10 at the end, +450

USA 3 Levine took the set 21-15, leaving USA 2 Simpson ahead 54-37.

2015 – FIRST BERMUDA BOWL FROM THE ALMANAC OF POLISH BRIDGE

Włodek Starkowski

There was some kind of fever before the start of the 2015 World Championships. A few teams withdrew, and just before the start the Credential Committee of WBF refused to allow to play one of Polish pairs. The Polish team started Robin Round 4-handed: Jacek Kalita, Michał Nowosadzki, Krzysztof Jassem and Marcin Mazurkiewicz. After a few days they were supported by Piotr Gawryś and Michał Klukowski and things started to go better for Poles.

They qualified for play off, in quarterfinals they won a tough match against France, but the real thriller was in the semifinal against Great Britain. The match was decided in the very last board (do you remember New Orleans 1978?). After 95 boards Forrester and Co. were leading 205.3-201.

About 8000 people watched the last board on BBO:

Let's look to the Daily Bulletin (Mark Horton's article):

The English pair use a double of 1NT to show the majors or 18+ (partner can relay via 2♣ with 10+ and 2♦ with 0- 9). 2♣/♦ overcall would promise clubs/diamonds and a major. Having passed on the first round it was perhaps incumbent on East to bid 3♣ on the next one, but these things are much easier from where I am sitting. East led the ace of clubs and switched to the six of diamonds for the king and ace. When declarer played the nine of spades East put up the queen and played the ten of diamonds, declarer winning with the queen and playing the four of spades. East played the eight and time stood still as declarer considered playing dummy's ten. Had he done so the defenders would have been able to cross ruff for one down, but when he eventually played the ace he had eight tricks.

6 IMPs that took Poland to their second Bermuda Bowl final.

The final match against Sweden was a real rollercoaster.

Poland started with the carry-over of 10.5 imp and won first stanza 39-37. Sweden won second part 57-36, lading after 32 boards 94-85.5. Last segment of the first day of the match was some kind of Swedish hammer – 60-18 and teams went to sleep with Sweden leading by 50 imps (154-103.5). Still 5 segments, 16 boards each left...

Second day morning and afternoon were in white and red – Poles won first 16 boards 61-10, and the match was practically tied (164,5-164 for Poland) and so were second (45-7) and third (27-19). That night the mood probably was quite different. But it was not over.

First of the two last sessions was like Swedish hammer again – 70-6 and with 16 boards to the end Sweden was leading by 17 imps – 260-242,5.

And like on real rollercoaster, there was a swing of action one more time – last stanza was won by Poland 65-33, the whole match 307,5-293 and POLAND name was engraved on Bermuda Bowl for the first time.

There aren't limits to the number of players per team (but read the rules). The Captain will be responsible for his players and has to guarantee that all them have read the rules, especially the System Policy and the Anti-cheating policy paragraphs.

How to get to the Bridge Festival venue: Conventum Arena (Fabriksgatan 28) is situated in the middle of the city, just 200 meters from the Örebro Södra train station, and straight across the street from Scandic Grand Hotel.
