He continued with the ♠J and East ducked as West pitched the ♣9. Declarer now played two top diamonds, but East ruffed the second, cashed the ♠A and exited with a club to dummy's king. A heart lost to East's king and another club forced out declarer's remaining trump, so East could score two more tricks, +50 and 11 IMPs.

As the card lie, declarer must not play a second round of trumps. If he forces out the heart honours he should come to eight tricks.

At the end of the session USA 1 Wolfson led 34-29.

So Club king or Diamond? A diamond doesn't wake up the bear! After two rounds of diamonds, declarer played Ace and King of hearts, which was ruffed. Club King was returned, and one down, when declarer couldn't establish the heart.

At the other table Bengt-Erik Efraimsson was declarer and defender after ace of spades played a heart..

Declarer won the heart return and cashed two rounds of diamond, crossed dummy to club Ace and played a heart. The defence couldn't do anything to avoid declarer taking his 11 tricks.

But what is the safest play? After one round of trumps, just play a low heart after ace of heart, in case heart is singleton on the other hand! But losing one imp on playing safe each time, that will also cost a lot ofimps!



Bermuda Bowl Again FROM THE ALMANAC OF POLISH BRIDGE

The Bermuda Bowl of 2019 was held in the Chinese city of Wuhan. The Polish open team did not qualify from European championships 2018, where it finished in an unlucky 9th place, but the Monaco team withdrew and Poland could take its place. Championships started on 14th September.

Polish team had following players on the roster: Krzysztof Buras, Grzegorz Narkiewicz, Bartosz Chmurrski, Piotr Tuczyński, Jacek Kalita, Michał Nowosadzki, npc Marek Pietraszek, coach Marek Wójcicki. They started Robin Round rather slowly (10th at the half mark, after 12 rounds) nonetheless qualified for play offs without greater problems. Then tough quarterfinal against China (215-141) came and semifinal against USA 1. This match could be a real example of what bridge can be. Tough competition at the table and friendship during breaks. And the final against Netherlands. The Dutch team won first two segments (37-9 and 37-32), but the third one was for Poland 39-17 and after first day the Netherlands led by 1 single imp 91-90.

Fourth stanza built substantial advantage to Poland. Let's look at one of the boards from that stage:

Narkiewicz played ♠ 4 and next BBO comment was:

Three spade tricks were cashed immediately and contract was set by one trick.

In the live vuegraph hall some spectator said: „*Bridge Gods from Poland came to win here*”.

The Polish team won that stanza 58-8, but the Dutch team tried to recover, winning two last sets 28-11 and 26-15. In the last set there was a slam played by De Wijs, which could turn the result of the match if the contract was made.

The final score was 174-153 for Poland and on the Bermuda Bowl POLAND'S name was engraved for the second time.

During the Championships the city of Wuhan founded the cup for the winners of new championships – world mixed teams, and they are now played as „Wuhan Cup”. It was very good move from the Wuhan administration to get some publicity this way. If they only knew what would start a month later...

There aren't limits to the number of players per team (but read the rules). The Captain will be responsible for his players and has to guarantee that all them have read the rules, especially the System Policy and the Anti-cheating policy paragraphs.
