South led the ♦9 and declarer went up with dummy's ace and played three rounds of spades, ruffing in dummy. North overruffed, cashed the ♦K and continued with the queen, ruffed and overruffed by South who exited with a spade. Declarer ruffed with dummy's six and cashed the ♣A on which South dropped the king. Declarer ruffed a club high so that was three down, -150.

If declarer come to hand with a trump at trick two and plays the ♣Q, as the cards lie he should merge with 12 tricks, the losing diamond going on a club and the fourth spade being ruffed in dummy. However, given the absence of any bidding by NS, playing for the majors to behave looks obvious.

West led the ♦J and East took the ace and returned the six, declarer claiming as soon as both defenders followed to the ♠J, +1430.

If West leads a heart declarer can win in dummy, draw trumps and cash the clubs, disposing of his hearts. Suppose East had a hand where he thought a heart lead would be a good idea? You could argue that a double of 3NT should suggest that, but just work out the score for 3NT redoubled with three overtricks!

West led the ♦2 and declarer went up with dummy's ace and played the ♣Q, covered by the king and ace. A spade went on the ♣J and declarer ruffed a club and played the ♦10. West won and returned the ♠Q and declarer won with the ace, ruffed a spade and drew trumps. East had come under pressure and declarer was able to score to heart tricks by playing a heart to the king and ducking a heart, three overtricks adding up to +480.

Insider Reports... FROM THE ALMANAC OF POLISH BRIDGE

We include in this series of articles some boards from the international competitions where Polish players had shown brilliance in their play.

It is worth mentioning that Polish championships are played on high level as well. Below are two examples.

First is from the Final Four of Polish first division 2019. We were able to play the finals live in June. In October we even started next season...

But let's look at the defense put up by Michał Kwiecień and Włodzimierz Starkowski (here in TSC POLAND 1 MARKOWICZ) from the play off for 3rd place at the Polish first division:

Kwiecien led the ace of diamonds. Starkowski followed with the ten (upside-down), showing five cards, and suggesting a heart switch. South now played a heart and, at the third trick, when the spade nine was played from dummy, Starkowski jumped up with the king!

And when it held, he continued with his last heart. One more trump from dummy allowed Kwiecień to win with his ace and give the partner a heart ruff, setting the contract. Textbook defence?

Second example, from 2020/21 season looks like a simple arithmetical problem. It was Piotr Zatorski who had to solve it.

1NT – one round forcing, one of the meanings is the game invitation with 3-card spade fit.

Kotorowicz led ♦10 (Polish leads – 2nd/4th). Araszkievicz won with the ace and made a clever return of ♦J, ruffed by declarer.

Let's switch the position with the declarer and try to make this contract.

We start the calculations... North did not open the bidding, and already had shown ♦AQJ (I hope you are not misled by the ♦J). He also has ace or king of clubs. How do we know it? If South has ♣AK, he would not underlead the diamond king, but he would surely try to „telescope” ace of clubs earlier.

Conclusion is simple... North has 10-11 HCP in minors, so he cannot have a heart king. Thus in theory the only chance to make 4♠ is to find singleton heart king at South hand...

It is in theory. Zatorski bet on psychological chance and in trick 3 played ♥9 from the hand!

Can Kotorowicz be blamed for ducking it?

It can be the only chance to set the contract if declarer's hand is something like:

♠ KQ10xxx ♥ 9x ♦ x ♣ A10xx

After heart nine, declarer cashed heart ace and claimed 12 tricks.

Could defenders do better here? It was enough to cash the club ace before exit with ♦J.
