MIDDLE OF THE ROAD

The 2019 World Championships will be remembered for a long time, in part because they took place in Wuhan, where the pandemic that has swept the world originated. There is an unproved theory that Covid-19 was already in existence (albeit unknown) at the time of the championships. In the D'Orsi Trophy England lost a hard fought final against Denmark and three of their silver medal winners are in the squad designated England Pryor. In Round 3 they faced the powerful team representing Lithuania. A good win would lift one of them from their current positions in the middle of the table.

North had the spade under control, but West had a second string to his bow and he was able to cash five clubs and a spade for -200 and 13 IMPs.

North led the ♦7 and declarer won with dummy's ace and played a spade, South winning and exiting with a diamond. Declarer ruffed with the ♠8, drew trumps and played a heart to the king. South cashed his winners for one down, -100.

Having escaped a heart lead one option for declarer would have been to play three round diamonds pitching two hearts, followed by a spade. He can ruff the diamond return high, draw trumps and play a club to the ten, still in the game if it loses to the jack. It was the line chosen by more than one declarer.

East led the ♦2 (a spade lead should not defeat 2NT) and declarer won with dummy's ace, came to hand with the ♣K and ducked a second club, East switching to the ♥7. That was allowed to run to declarer's queen and he continued with two rounds of diamonds, establishing the nine. He was up to ten tricks now and by the time he cashed the ♦9 West was down to the major suit kings. Naturally he pitched the ♥K so that was +210 and 7 IMPs.

That left England with a good win, 52-27.

FIRST EUROPEAN GOLD FROM THE ALMANAC OF POLISH BRIDGE

Włodek Starkowski

At the turn of the seventies and eighties of the twentieth century, Polish players were more and more visible at the international competitions. The real climax of success were the European Teams Championships 1981 at Birmingham. The Polish team dominated the field, winning 15 out of 17 matches, and at the finish their advantage over the second team of Great Britain was as much as 30 VP (20-0 scale).

Polish players – Marek Kudła - Andrzej Milde, Krzysztof Martens - Tomasz Przybora, Aleksander Jezioro - JULIAN KLUKOWSKI – have shown modern, very aggressive style.

It was an international debut of Martens and Przybora, who were very successful later, particularly Krzysztof Martens, while Przybora stopped playing at championship level about 2000. Kudła - Milde have won European Pairs Championships in Monte Carlo in 1980. You could read in the Pre-bulletin about Julian Klukowski.

when the last diamond was played, West found himself in a hopeless position. He had to concede last trick to the declarer, either to the jack of clubs, or to the king of spades.

In the fall of 1981, Poland, playing in the same squad, won the first medal for Poland in Bermuda Bowl, so far only bronze.

Bermuda Bowl 1981 was significant not only for Polish team, but also for some world superstars – it was first gold in Bermuda Bowl for Jeff Meckstroth - Eric Rodwell (here both USA 3 LEVINE) and the first, very successful appearance for Pakistan – silver medals. The driving force of Pakistani team was Zia Mahmood (here USA 4 LALL). Together with Poland, also players from Argentina, between them Eduardo Scanavino (here ARGENTINA), got bronze medals.
