I am willing to bet that someone misclicked at some point.

East led the ♣K and West overtook it with the ace and switched to the ♥4 for the nine, king and three. West took the heart return with the ace and now went back to clubs, East winning with the ten and continuing with the queen. Declarer pitched a spade and a diamond from hand and diamond from dummy, ruffed the fourth round of clubs, cashed the ♥Q, and then played diamonds. West ruffed and cashed the ♣J for four down, -800.

If West withholds the ♥A at trick three, putting in the ten or jack the contract should go five down.

North led the ♥K and declarer won with dummy's ace and played a spade to the ace and a spade to the ten and jack. South cashed the ♥J and switched to the ♦2, North winning with the ace and returning the ♥7. When declarer pitched a spade (no, it would not have occurred to me to ruff with the ♣K either) South ruffed, cashed the ♦K, North discarding the ♠9, and continued with the ♦8, ruffed by North who played the ♥Q, ruffed and overruffed by South who exited with the ♠K. Declarer had to lose to the ♣AJ, four down, -800.

Declarer took the lead of the ♥K with dummy's ace and returned the four, South winning with the jack and exiting with the ♣2 for the three, ace and seven. North returned the ♣4 and South won with the queen and played the ♦9, North taking the ace and switching to the ♠2 for the eight, jack and ace. A diamond to the queen saw South win, North throwing the ♠9 and the



next diamond was taken by dummy's jack as North discarded the ♥7. South took the ♠Q with the king and played the ♦8, ruffed by the ♣9 and overruffed by North who exited with the ♥Q. Declarer ruffed with dummy's ♣K and could play the ♠10, scoring the ♣8 at the end for five tricks, -500 and 7 IMPs.

West found the good lead of ♣A and declarer ruffed and ducked a diamond to East's ten. The ♥Q was covered by the king and ace and West exited with the ♣2, declarer ruffing and playing two rounds of diamonds. East won with the king and played the ♠2 and declarer took the ace and cashed the king. West could ruff declarer's diamond exit, cash the ♠Q and play a club which meant the contract was four down, -1100.

If declarer guesses that the trumps are 4-1 he can retain the ♠KJ and exit with a red card, either of them leading to seven tricks.

West led the ♥A and switched to the ♣A, declarer ruffing and playing a diamond for the queen and king. He ruffed the club return, cashed the ♥K, ruffed a heart, played a diamond to the ace and exited with a diamond. He ruffed the club return with the ♠J and played a diamond, West ruffing in with the ♠Q and returning a trump. Declarer had scored eight tricks, -500 and the 12 IMP swing gave Netherlands 1 the lead, 102-99.

## SANYA 2014 – ROSENBLUM AGAIN FROM THE ALMANAC OF POLISH BRIDGE

In 2014, again after 36 years, the team from Poland won The Rosenblum Cup – open World teams championships. The championships were held at Hainan resort city of Sanya. Polish team consisted of following players: Marcin Mazurkiewicz (captain), Krzysztof Jassem, Piotr Gawryś, Michał Klukowski, Stanisław Gołębiowski and Włodzimierz Starkowski (in TSC – POLAND 1 MARKOWICZ).

The most dramatic match of MAZURKIEWICZ in Sanya was played in round of 16 against team NICKELL - Nick Nickell, Ralph Katz, Bobby Levin, Steve Weinstein, Eric Rodwell, Jeff Meckstroth (two last played in TSC – USA 3 LEVINE). MAZURKIEWICZ won by 9imps (57-48).

First challenge was: which ace should be led?

Jassem passed it. Some kind of intuition made him cash the spade one.

Marcin Mazurkiewicz played the ten to the ace of spades – obvious suit preference signal and Jassem continued with a low heart. Let's look in the Daily Bulletin again: *Mazurkiewicz followed with the 10 and Jassem did not have to think hard to conclude*

*that Weinstein's leap to slam was likely based on a heart fit.*

Katz leads ♣ A and 18-years old declarer is careful enough to ruff it with the ace of trumps!

Continuation is simple – declarer draws the trumps and claims an overtrick. 1460 and 17imps for Poland.

In the quarterfinals MAZURKIEWICZ beat FLEISHER 88-75, in the semifinal VENTIN 90-76 and in the final they beat MONACO 131-80.

It was the first world title for Michał Klukowski (not related to the patron of TSC, Julian) who was then 18 years old and the youngest ever player to win the open world bridge championships. He followed with gold medals in Bermuda Bowl 2015 in Chennai (also becoming the youngest ever Bermuda Bowl winner) and in World Transnational Teams Championships in Lyon 2017. Today he is one of the greatest stars of the world bridge.

It was also first world title for Marcin Mazurkiewicz, who started playing bridge on international level in 2013, winning the European open teams championships in Ostende. He won three world championships gold medals in 2014, 2015, 2017, the same as Michał Klukowski, plus two bronze medals (Bermuda Bowl 2013 and World Bridge Series 2016) and in 2018 retired from play... Probably he found some new challenges, may be something more interesting is coming.

**By car:** 200 km from Stockholm. 280 km from Gothenburg. 500 km from Malmö.

**How to get to the Bridge Festival venue:** Conventum Arena (Fabriksgatan 28) is situated in the middle of the city, just 200 meters from the Örebro Södra train station, and straight across the street from Scandic Grand Hotel.
